

SSI Advanced Adventurer and Junior Advanced Adventurer

Have you just completed your Open Water Diver Course or Open Water Referral Dives and want more training before you finish your holidays?

The SSI Advanced Adventurer or Junior Advanced Adventurer program is a simple way to introduce you to a variety of specialty areas you are interested in. Choose five specialty areas you would like to experience. Then, complete an academic overview and one dive in each specialty area to receive your recognition card.

SSI Specialty Courses: Altitude Diving, Boat Diving, Computer Diving, Deep Diving, Diver Stress & Rescue, Dry Suit Diving, Enriched Air Nitrox, Equipment Techniques, Navigation, Night & Limited Visibility Diving, Search & Recovery, Underwater Photography, Waves, Tides & Currents, Wreck Diving, and Unique Specialties written by SSI Instructors.

The SSI Advanced Adventurer is a recognition program only and does not replace the current SSI Advanced Open Water Diver program. As a student in the SSI Advanced Adventurer program you will be recognised for your experience and can apply your dives to your SSI Advanced Open Water certification in the future. To upgrade to the SSI Advanced Open Water Diver level all you must do is complete a thorough academic review in at least four of the specialty areas, complete one more dive for each of those four specialties and log 24 total dives and then you will be certified SSI Advanced Open Water Diver!

Each of your dives will be a skill dive from a different and approved SSI specialty course. Your Instructor will inform you of what you need to do to fulfil a complete specialty or Specialty Diver or Advanced Open Water Diver ratings.



What the Course Includes

- Internationally accepted recognition card upon successful completion of the course
- 5 academic sessions
- Minimum of 5 open water training dives
- Professional Dive Instructor and Assistant Instructor fees
- Use of the pool and facilities during training
- Use of all required diving equipment including air fills
- Transportation to the dive sites

** it is highly recommended students have their own personal equipment: mask, snorkel, booties, fins, equipment bag, knife, and time piece.*

Course Requirements

- The minimum age for participation in the SSI Junior Advanced Adventurer course is 12 years old and 15 years old for SSI Advanced

Adventurer.

- Students are required to be in generally good health and complete a medical questionnaire. Students may be referred to a medical professional for clearance to dive.

Course Scheduling

Private course - Students may enrol in evening, split-week, or weekend courses, or create their own schedule. Contact the Dive Centre to schedule a course.



Responsible Diver Code:

"As a responsible Diver, I understand and assume all risks I may encounter while diving".

My Responsible Diving Duties include:

1. Diving within the limits of my ability and training.
2. Evaluating the conditions before every dive and making sure they fit my personal capabilities.
3. Being familiar with and checking my equipment before and during every dive.
4. Respecting the Buddy System and its advantages.
5. Accepting the responsibility for my own safety on every dive.
6. Being environmentally conscious on every dive.
